Cindy Baxter for Cemetery: Mrs. Baxter was letting the board know that they have moved into the back part of the office now that everything is cleanout, she would like to patch a few holes and paint the office. She does have one concern about the window that is leaking badly and just wanted to let the Board know if they hadn't seen it. She talked about wanting to get a new computer software program for keeping track of the plots in the cemeteries in town. How many there is for sale and who owns the ones that have been sold and who is buried there.
- **4. ACO report:** Mrs. Dufresne stated that this last year has been a learning curve and had to purchased lot of equipment, items that she needed to do her job. She is well stocked up for now and a couple of years to come. She also spoke about the comradery of other Animal Control Officers in other towns, and she feel very grateful for the support she gets from town. She let the board know that she has 3 goals for this next year.
  - a. To find a better way of documenting the animal inspector, phone, over the internet and in person responses that she does each month. To find a system that can talk with the Town Clerk, Police, Tax Collector, so they know what outstanding bills that need to be paid.
  - b. Work on an emergency response for the animals in case of an emergency.
  - c. Compete all of her continuing education credit. She is almost done but is hoping to have completed soon.




